RoSA Certificate Award Guideline

Wentworthville Tamil Study Centre (WTSC) issues RoSA certificates to WTSC students who have completed Year 10, Year 11, or Year 12 and are not undertaking the HSC. The Centre plays a vital role in supporting students' Tamil language proficiency, cultural engagement, and academic development, aligning with NESA's standards for community language education.

To qualify for the RoSA certificate, students must meet all requirements outlined in this document, including attendance, behaviour, assessment participation, and curriculum engagement.

1. Curriculum Engagement

- Students are expected to actively participate in all Tamil language classes and learning activities.
- Lessons follow the NSW curriculum for Stage 4 and Stage 5 (Years 7–10), which form part of the broader Tamil studies under the NSW K–10 Syllabus, so students should complete all classwork, projects, and assignments on time.
- Students should demonstrate consistent effort in developing reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills in Tamil.

2. Assessment Participation

- Students must take part in regular assessments such as quizzes, oral tasks, reading exercises, and written activities.
- Assessment results contribute to demonstrating progress and sustained effort, key requirements under the RoSA framework.
- Students are encouraged to reflect on feedback and work towards continual improvement throughout the academic year.

3. Attendance Requirement

- Students must maintain a minimum overall attendance rate of 70% when attendance from all four terms combined is calculated for the academic year.
- Consistent attendance shows commitment to learning and is essential for eligibility for the RoSA certificate.
- Absences should be explained in writing by a parent or guardian, and students are responsible for catching up on missed work.

4. Behaviour and Conduct

- Students are expected to maintain respectful and responsible behaviour at all times, both in class and during school activities.
- Positive participation, cooperation with peers, and respect for teachers and cultural values are essential qualities for certification.
- Repeated breaches of conduct may affect a student's eligibility to receive the certificate.

5. Communication and Reporting

- Students and parents will receive termly progress updates summarising attendance, assessment results, and achievements.
- Students should maintain open communication with teachers regarding learning goals, difficulties, or absences.
- Parents are encouraged to support their child's Tamil language learning at home and liaise with WTSC staff when needed.

6. Outcome

- Students who meet all the requirements outlined in this document including attendance, behaviour, assessment participation, curriculum engagement and achieve a minimum average of 35% across all tests will be awarded a RoSA Certificate for Successful Completion.
- Students who meet all other guideline requirements but achieve below an average of 35% across all tests will be awarded a RoSA Certificate for Participation.
- The final outcome will be determined by the RoSA Panel, comprising the Principal, Upper School Principal, RoSA Coordinator, and the class teacher(s).
