WTSC – HSC Class Division Guideline

1. Purpose

To establish a fair and consistent process for dividing HSC classes into two or more balanced groups based on student performance.

Due to the increasing number of students in each class beyond Australian education standards, along with the ongoing constructive feedback from parents and educators regarding class sizes, WTSC recognises the need for adjustments to ensure optimal learning environments. This step is essential to maintain the quality of education and support the individual needs of each student.

Disclaimer: The principles and allocations are based on a two-class model but can be adjusted proportionally for additional class splits and total numbers (e.g 3 class).

2. Class Naming

- Classes will end with sequential numbers.

Example: Year 12 Agaththiyar Class 1 (ஆண்டு 12 அகத்தியர் வகுப்பு ஒன்று)
Year 12 Agaththiyar Class 2 (ஆண்டு 12 அகத்தியர் வகுப்பு இரண்டு)

3. Equal Curriculum

- All classes follow the same syllabus, lesson plans, and assessments.
- Teachers must coordinate to maintain equal teaching standards and marking criteria.

4. Student Placement

- students are ranked based on their average marks from all assessments.
- The top half of the class are placed in Class 1, and the bottom half of the class are placed in Class 2.
- If the total number of students is odd, the extra student is placed in Class 1.

Example: If there are 21 students, half of the class is 10.5, rounded up to 11.

Class 1: Top 11 students (highest averages)

Class 2: Remaining 10 students (lower averages)

5. New Students

- All newly enrolled students will initially join Class 2.
- Placement will be reviewed at the end of the semester for possible movement.
- If the number of students exceeds the capacity or creates an uneven proportion, adjust placement based on previous markings. The student next in line will be allocated to the higher-performing group, while all new students will initially remain in the low performing group.

6. Re-Ranking and Movement

- Rankings are updated each semester based on performance.
- Students may move between Class 1 and Class 2 or further according to updated averages.

8. Review

- This guideline will be reviewed annually or as required to maintain fairness and effectiveness.
